Acceptance into the Career and Technical Education programs will be based on a holistic approach with the primary indicator being the student’s interest. An interest inventory will be required and available through NYSED/DOL Career Zone (<http://www.mynextmove.org/explore/ip>). The student’s 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade attendance, grades, and behavior will also be evaluated holistically, but may not be used to preclude the student’s admission into a Career and Technical Education program. Additionally, all available seats in 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grades will be filled to capacity and no student should be denied access due to secondary indicators if an opening exists.
